Title in red and black on both t-p and front wrapper, original printed wrappers with gilt-stamped emblem/arms of the Italian Geographical Society. Bound in near contemp. quarter leather and marbled paper over boards, gilt lettering to spine divided in six compartments by five raised bands, marbled endpapers. A fine copy of this book about Southern Somalia.









FIRST EDITION, first issue. 8vo, ix, [1], 687, [1] pp. and 8 final pp. of publisher's catalogue (dated November 1, 1857). A total of 47 illustrations: 18 wood engravings in the text; 24 full-page engraved plates out of the text, including the author's portrait by William Holl after Henry Phillips, still protected by its tissue guard, and a folding geological cross section facing

p. 569; 3 tinted lithographs by W. West, that is, the large folding frontispiece showing the Victoria Falls, the "Lake Ngami" plate facing p. 66, and the "Bechuana Reed Dance by Moonlight" plate, after a sketch by C. Bell, facing p. 225; a final folding map, bound before the publisher's advertisements, and another loose folding map in end-pocket. Except for the chromolithographs, all woodcut illustrations are printed in black and white. Maps engraved by Arrowsmith, both showing Livingstone's route outlined in red. Original blind-stamped pale brown cloth, gilt letterings to spine, deckled edges. Binder's ticket (Edmonds & Remnants), bookseller's ticket (Penn, 213, Regent St.). Hinges a bit weak, though firm, the text block just beginning to loosen in a couple of places. A reasonably bright copy of the complete true first edition with three tinted plates and no additional leaf following p. 8, which was added in the later issues.

The book covers the first of Livingstone's three major expeditions "in which he followed the Zambezi, discovering Victoria Falls in the process, as well as the Shire and Ruyuma rivers, ranging from Angola in the west to Mozambique in the east During these years he explored vast regions of central Africa, many of which had never been seen by white men before" (PMM).



Contemp. dark brown buckram over boards, blind-tooling on covers and gilt decorated morocco spine divided in compartments. Maginal old blue ink stain to foot of a few initial leaves, towards gutter, not affecting the text. A.e.g., An excellent copy.















Contemp. leather over boards, recently rebacked, renewed endpapers. Red morocco label with gilt lettering to spine. Very light browning throughout. A very good copy.

This edition, or one published in N.Y. also in 1800, was the initial U.S. edition of Park's account of his African explorations. The book includes at end, before the appendix, a "Negro Song from Mr Park's travels" and "a Vocabulary of the Mandingo Language."

Paper exlibris of Major General Sir Archibald E. Harbord Anson glued to upper pastedown and a newspaper slip cut out of The Times on verso of front free endpaper with G. P. Fuller's article, dated March 22, 1921, about the controversial account of Speke's death by Richard Barton, who was the other famous explorer accompanying the author in the search for the Nile's source. Very occasional light foxing to margins, a few negligible marginal thumbmarks. Publisher's reddish-brown cloth, gilt-stamped king of Uganda bearing a spear and walking his dog on centre of front cover. Skillfully rebacked spine, preserving the original cloth with gilt letterings. Reinforced hinges. A very good copy.
